Board of Trustees Update

Pella Christian's Board of Trustees met for our regular meetings in October and November. The budget, stewardship, and mission statement were key topics for board discussion and discernment.

2025-2026 brings many changes. By law, the minimum public school teacher salary will be \$50,000 per year. While not a requirement for Pella Christian, we want to pay our teachers fairly to continue attracting high-quality staff. Insurance, capital repairs, and supply costs also increased at an alarming rate recently, putting pressure on the expense side of the budget.

On the other hand, 2025-2026 is the first year every student is eligible for an ESA. We have never charged families for the true cost of education. ESAs bring the opportunity to raise more revenue at a time to meet these increasing costs and continue providing outstanding Christian education. Building a budget around these major changes is a prayerful act of stewardship.

The Board also invested time in our mission and vision process. In November we gathered stakeholders to garner feedback and direction. We are asking the big questions - with thousands of Christian schools around the country and world, what makes Pella Christian unique, special, distinct? Our foundation is surely God's Word. But how do we live that calling out uniquely in south central lowa?

We know that God has big plans for each one of us and for Pella Christian! As leaders of the school, the Board of Trustees is working, praying, and discerning what those plans are and how to best accomplish them.


Throughout the Bible, names often hold a level of significance or meaning. For example, Abraham was given his new name to mark the covenant God made to make him the "father of many nations." In the 2023-2024 school year, Pella Christian participated in the statewide testing program for the first year since the new test was written. The lowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress has tests in three areas: Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science. Students in grades three through eleven participate in the assessment. The graph above shows the results by percentages of all students that participated in the assessment last year.

Finally, we must remember that we are called to be a "School." That may seem basic, but it really is not. School is a complicated endeavor that requires understanding people, pedagogy (methods of teaching), content and tools. The research on best practices in education have exploded in the last ten years, and as professionals, we must continue to learn and grow in the craft of teaching. It requires us to be mindful of the new things we must take on and the long-established things that are tried and true. All of this, of course, to best set into action the equipping of students with the knowledge and skills to make an impact.

Pella Christian Schools continues to live into its name. Like Abraham, we are imperfect, but with God's help we continue to strive to hold true to the course He set before us.
